### **Mirror Lake**

Mirror Lake can be found as you head east from Kamas into the Uinta Mountains, through the Wasatch-Cache National Forest. In addition to scenic viewpoints and picnic areas, numerous lakes and campgrounds line this high-mountain byway. Much of the journey parallels the Provo River. The byway climbs to an elevation of 10,687 feet at Bald Mountain Pass before descending past Mirror Lake, then to Bear River Ranger Station with its Historical Tie Hack Cabin.
